## **Summer camp 2024: The Netherlands the Dutch way**

*.. a summer camp to gain unforgettable experiences, and insight into nature and culture in the Netherlands. Your accommodations will be in a green, relatively quiet area with plenty of space to be active, but also a setting to relax.*

*During the two weeks you spend with us, you will visit nature reserves, wander through museums, and several tourist highlights are planned. You will be active, both on land and (perhaps) in the water..*

*Above all, you will have made new international friends!.*

**To participate in the camp, you must be open to many different activities which appeal to both your mind and body. It is expected you are in reasonable physical condition, and able to cycle and swim.**

### **Information about the camp**

- Date:** arrival Saturday June 29, 2024, departure Saturday July 13, 2024
- Participants:** 16 young people, 8 men and 8 women, from different countries. Age: 18-20 years.
- Arrival and departure:** Participants are picked up/dropped off from Schiphol Airport. Plan your trip so your arrival is on Saturday June 29 between 10:00 and 14:00 and your departure is on Saturday July 13 between 11:00 and 15:00. Pick-up and drop-off to international trains around the same time slots is of course, also possible.
- Global programme:** The first two days you will stay in a group accommodation (separate rooms for men and women) on the edge of a nature reserve with game activities, campfire, and cooking together. Next, you will stay for several days within 2 different guest addresses at the organizing Rotary clubs. There you will experience daily life on site and become familiar with the immediate surroundings. There will be time to explore as well as relax, alone or with the group.



Many joint activities are also planned. You will stroll through the most beautiful heathland and forest areas in the South and East of the Netherlands, as well as visit the wide sandy beaches of the North Sea. You can follow a golf clinic, canoe, sup, and for those who dare...a mountain bike tour. Of course, a visit to Amsterdam is not without several highlights. Also be surprised by the beautiful 's-Hertogenbosch - from a tour boat. You can experience art and culture in Van Gogh's hometown as well as when you visit the world-famous Kröller-Müller Museum. For an introduction to technology, we will go to an innovation center and an automotive campus ...



At the end, a memorable final evening and a heart and mind full of beautiful memories.

**Costs:** your cost responsibility for contribution of the camp is €.350,- after placement and due before arrival. Furthermore, travel arrangements and expenses to and from the Netherlands is your responsibility, as well as spending money for personal expenses. Accommodation, almost all meals and transport within the Netherlands are covered by the Rotary Clubs.



**Insurance:** Rotary will take out insurance for you that covers the costs of damage, accidents and medical expenses during your stay. For more information, see: <http://yep-insurance-rotary>.

**Accommodation:** as indicated under 'global program', you will stay in a group accommodation for the first two days: rooms with bunk beds and a common room with kitchen. The other days accommodations will be at 2 different guest addresses.



**Language and food:** the main language is English. The meals are European, always with the option of vegetarian.

**What to bring:** In addition to casual wear, it is good to bring swimwear and comfortable, light walking shoes. General advice is: travel light!

**Registration:** follow the procedure as specified on the page of your national Rotary website. Register before April 1. We will match the options and inform you if you have been placed for this camp as soon as possible..
